Dear Mr. Henderson:

The purpose of this letter is to convey the results of the record review conducted by the Department of Developmental Services' (DDS) Early Start program staff in collaboration with staff from your Early Start program. This review, which took place over four days, May 25-28, 2010, at South Central Los Angeles Regional Center (SCLARC), was conducted to ensure that California meets Part C of the Individuals with Disabilities Education Act (IDEA) requirements. IDEA requires DDS to monitor agencies receiving federal Part C funds.

We appreciate the participation and cooperation of your staff with this review. The SCLARC Early Start managers and team members made themselves readily available to clarify procedures and answer any of our questions during the review. The records reflected a strong commitment from SCLARC in providing services to toddlers and infants receiving Early Start services.

A detailed Early Start Record Review Report of findings is enclosed. Please review the results with your Early Start staff. The federal Office of Special Education Programs (OSEP) and California's State Performance Plan requires that correction and verification of non-compliance findings be made within one year from the date of receipt of this letter. For future reviews, 100 percent compliance is required for all items audited. SCLARC is required to submit a plan of correction addressing the areas of non-compliance to DDS within 30 days from receipt of this letter. The following are examples of appropriate corrective actions you may choose to incorporate:

1. Develop and provide new written procedures or forms to DDS;
2. Conduct staff training(s) and submit documentation of the training(s) to DDS;

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3. Access the personnel development scholarships and training grants (information is available at www.wested.org/cs/cpei); and
4. Any other actions that you may find beneficial in addressing areas of non-compliance.
