SSRS Data: Updated December 15, 2014

In response to Trailer Bill, AB 1472 (Chapter 25, Statues of 2012), the Department of Developmental Services (DDS) established the Statewide Specialized Resource Service (SSRS). The SSRS tracks the availability of specialty residential beds and services; tracks the availability of specialty clinical services; coordinates the need for specialty services and supports, in conjunction with regional centers; and tracks requests for developmental center services and supports for consumers residing in the community when no other community resources have been identified.

CPP developed resources listed in the SSRS database include but are not limited to services such as Evaluation and Behavioral Intervention; Licensed Specialized Residential Facilities (Habilitation and Health): Community Care Facilities both for children and adults; Intermediate Care Facilities – DD-H and DD-N; Supported Living Services; Adult Development Services; Community Integration Training Program services, etc. The following page includes a listing of the number of resources by service code.

The following is a summary of the most common types of services being requested by regional centers covering the period from October 2012 through October 2014.

The SSRS staff received 379 referrals with at least one referral from each of the 21 regional centers. Of the 379 referrals, 209 referrals were made collectively by northern regional centers and 170 were made collectively by southern regional centers. The most frequently requested services were for the following supports or service provider specialties:

¹Severe Aggression: Property Destruction: Breaking or throwing furniture, breaking residential windows, doors, walls, appliances, breaking vehicle windows and interiors. Physical Aggression: Assaults causing injuries by hitting, biting, pushing, scratching, choking and throwing objects. Hurting and killing animals.

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2Self Injurious Behavior: Suicidal attempts. Hitting, scratching and cutting self. Banging head into walls, glass windows and floors. Running into traffic. Rectal digging and fecal smearing.
