Individuals and staff get ready for the day: In the morning after getting ready, eating breakfast, packing their lunch, each person gets ready to go. We have individual who uses a cane inside. This individual has a walker with wheels. The walker does not work well inside because it catches on the carpet. Staff takes the walker down the stairs and get it ready for this individual. Staff makes sure the individual gets down the stairs and gets into their transportation from program. The other residents go on to their programs or jobs as well. Upon return: Staff makes sure residents gets up the stairs and staff brings the walker up the stairs and into the home. The individuals resumes using the cane inside. All other residents return as well.
Identify which HCBS federal requirements this concept addresses that are currently out of compliance.	#10: Ramp to access the home with a walker or wheelchair. This will help the residents stay in the home and the community in which they have lived in many years.  #10: Laminate floors to ease the residents walking with canes, walkers or wheelchairs. We have residents with allergies and Asthma problems. By putting in laminate flooring an added benefit to residents is that by providing a cleaner healthier environment, residents breathing problems may be lessened. So residents can continue living in the home and community in which they have lived in for many years.  #4. Van with a capacity for 8 occupants. Van is needed to transport residents to and from activities of their choice. Van is needed with capacity for 8 occupants to be able to transport all plus staff for recreational activities and outings.

Federal requirement #10. Ramp: To give access and safety to all residents to the home so they can continue to live an independent life as possible in the home and community they have lived in for many years. Residents who need a walker or wheelchair temporarily or permanently would be able to stay in the home.  Federal requirement #10. Laminate flooring, is needed so that walkers, wheelchairs can move around in an easier manner. This would give the residents independence. Residents can then continue to live in the home and community they have lived in many years.

The residents are all pretty verbal. Our home believes in person centered as a whole.
