Why did DDS undertake a rate study?

- DDS is required to complete a rate study
- The study must address "the sustainability, quality, and transparency of home and community based services for individuals with developmental disabilities"*
- DDS hired consultants to complete this study
- DDS also added opportunities for individuals and families to provide input

Who is working on this rate study?

- Burns & Associates, Inc.
 - Has developed provider rates in Arizona, Georgia, Hawaii, Maine, Mississippi, New Mexico, Oregon, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Virginia
- Human Services Research Institute
 - Non-profit organization helping to craft community-based, persondriven systems
- Mission Analytics
 - San Francisco-based consulting firm with experience with long-term services and supports

What services are included in the rate study?

Examples include:

- Personal Assistance
- Community-based Day Programs
- Supported Employment
- Residential services
- Behavioral support
- Transportation

About 90% of the money spent are for services included in the rate study

Only services provided by Regional Centers are included




A rate is the amount of money Regional Centers pay service providers for services, like supported living

There are many ways to pay for services.

Rates might be different depending on what they include, such as:

- Service type
- Staff qualifications
- Service time (part day, full day)
- Location



WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW



What's important to know?

- Rate models were developed using independent data and are based on service requirements as they exist today
- Public comment process is open and materials are posted

What's important to know?

The rate models :

- Include benefits for staff (like vacation and insurance)
- Recognize regional differences
- Pay for more training, including cultural sensitivity
- Have bilingual stipends to support people who do not speak English or use sign language


How are the rate models intended to support quality?

Rate models include items such as:

- Supervision for direct support staff
- Training for staff (including cultural sensitivity)
- Consideration of regional differences (like costs for housing)



WHAT WAS DONE?



Independent Rate Setting Approach

- Information was collected from many sources including:
 - State policies, rules, and regulations
 - Surveys (providers, service users, and family members)
 - Published sources (Bureau of Labor Statistics, IRS mileage rates)



- Available from May to August 2018
- 1,100 organizations responded to the survey (52% of revenue)
- Developed in close collaboration with DDS and the Rates Workgroup
- Assistance was available if providers had questions about the survey



Individual & Family Survey

- Online survey for people with disabilities and their families
- Available on Survey Monkey from October 4th-28th, 2018
- Available in 16 languages
- Over 1,700 people took the survey
- Most were family members of people with disabilities

A few things to keep in mind about this survey!



What did the survey ask?

Service recipients or family member characteristics

Satisfaction with supports

Experiences with accessing and receiving services

What did we learn from the survey?

People mostly said their staff and services were good About half of people had good experiences accessing support

There were differences among some groups

Full results are available online

How were the rate models developed?


- Rate models were built for each service included in the rate study
- The rate models include "assumptions". For example just because the rate includes a staff wage of \$14.44 per hour, that does not mean that agencies have to pay staff that exact amount

How were the rate models developed?

To build the rate models B&A considered:


- What the service is
- Time that the provider spends with the person
- Regional differences in cost
- Staff qualifications



These are examples and can be different depending on the service.


Example of Personal Assistance 1:1

GENERAL INFORMATION

Pursuant to Welfare and Institutions Code Section 4519.8, the Department of Developmental Services (DDS) is required to submit a rate study addressing the sustainability, quality, and transparency of community-based services for individuals with developmental disabilities to the Legislature by March 1, 2019. To assist with this effort, DDS contracted with health-policy consulting firm Burns & Associates, Inc. to conduct the rate study with DDS oversight.
