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RECOMMENDATIONS

 During the monitoring review, the Department of Developmental Services (DDS) reviewed multiple transition plans which did not identify or address concerns relating to the transition process. Many plans were determined to contain generic or canned language in the area of transition steps and services. Several plans contained similar information with minimal individualized steps and services. DDS was able to gather enough information through reviewing the IFSP and Transition Plan together to meet compliance. However, DDS recommends TCRC review the transition procedures and train staff to ensure steps and services are comprehensive, individualized and address concerns relating to the transition process.
