### State Interagency Coordinating Council on Early Intervention Day One Meeting Minutes Thursday, April 19, 2018 WestEd 10:00 a.m. – 4:00 p.m.

# Opening

Dr. Marie Kanne Poulsen called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m.

Introductions and Roll Call were conducted.

The January 2018 Meeting Minutes were approved without amendments.

The Council reviewed the Agenda, which was approved.

Florence Bracy announced that she has authored a book, *Help Me Understand My Child*, which is available on Amazon.com. The book is a roadmap to help families and professionals navigate the world of special needs.

The Part C Literacy resource shared during the meeting was a TED Talk video entitled, *Good and Bad are Incomplete Stories We Tell Ourselves*. In this talk, Heather Lanier questions assumptions about what makes a life "good" or "bad" and references them to her experience raising a child with developmental disabilities. She asserts to take life as it comes and to make the most of every opportunity. Another good resource with a similar message is the book *Expecting Adam* by Martha Beck.

## The Department of Developmental Services (DDS) Update

Sharon DeRego provided the DDS update. DDS submitted the California Annual Performance Report (APR) in February. The State Systemic Improvement Plan (SSIP) Report for FY 16-17 was submitted in April. The Part C Grant will be submitted in May.

## Annual Performance Report Breakdown

Sharon DeRego provided an overview of California's 2015-2016 APR. California received an overall determination of Needs Intervention with a score of less than 60% in some areas. California has improved substantially in the timeliness in which the state responds to complaints. Moving forward, DDS will focus on improving its scores. DDS plans to work with the regional centers to gather information and data to facilitate improvement. To improve on the compliance issues, DDS plans to monitor additional regional centers more frequently, including looking at more cases and providing additional technical assistance. The Council volunteered to assist with the monitoring process.

There was a discussion about the Early Start assessment timeline; some regional centers start the timeline on the date the call is received and others start when the call is responded to. Clarification on this issue would be helpful to regional centers.

California has a complicated structure as services vary county to county. The Council posed the following questions: How do other large states meet the requirements? What does their system look like? How is data captured/reported?

Sharon DeRego also provided data and evaluation highlights from the SSIP including the Take a Minute campaign, the Early Start Online Social and Emotional Open Access Course, and the Local Implementation Team Trainings.

### **Drowning Prevention**

Nancy Lungren, DDS Assistant Director for Communications, informed the Council about the annual drowning prevention initiative. In California, drowning is a leading cause of injury-related deaths among children under the age of five. Each year, near-drowning incidents result in life-long disabilities. DDS and its partners continue to raise awareness on this issue, reminding parents and caregivers that drowning is preventable.

A Governor's letter on drowning prevention will be available in May. The DDS website has a variety of resources supporting drowning awareness. DDS would like the Council's support in spreading the word about this important issue. DDS will also continue to promote the initiative through the regional centers and other partners.

## LAO Report Discussion

The Council recapped the discussions held throughout the state related to the California Legislative Analyst's Office (LAO) report *Evaluating California's System for Serving Infants and Toddlers With Special Needs*. The report provided background on the Early Start system along with an assessment and resulting recommendations.

The Council Chair stated that there is a role for the Council, professional organizations and individuals to inform, educate and raise awareness about the Early Start system. This report serves to broaden the conversation and to identify areas of opportunity within the system. It is important to continue to facilitate this conversation. As the Council has significant expertise in this arena, the Council Chair feels it is appropriate to respond to the report.

The Council meeting adjourned at 12:15 p.m. and the Improving State Systems and Communication and Outreach Committee meetings commenced at 1:30 p.m. The committee meetings adjourned at 3:45 p.m.
