Making Medical Homes Safer

What to know

Regional centers and staff at certain kinds of homes where people with a lot of medical needs live have to start following new rules to help keep people safe from COVID-19.

The new rules are for two kinds of homes:

- Adult Residential Facilities for Persons with Special Health Care Needs (ARFPSHN)
- Intermediate Care Facilities/Developmentally Disabled-Continuous Nursing (ICF/DD-CN)

Home safety

Ways to help keep COVID-19 from spreading:

- All visitors and residents will be screened for fevers and other signs of being sick.
- People with fevers higher than 100.4° F or COVID-19 symptoms won't be able to visit.
- Staff who get sick can't return to work until the local county public health department says they can.
- Everyone who lives in the home should stay in their own room if they can, or at least stay 6 feet away from other people.
- Staff are being asked to only work in one place and will get extra training on how to reduce risk of infection.
