Chronology for Safety Net Support Services

April 19, 2021

October 2005 – SB 962 (Chapter 558, Statutes of 2005) homes: ARFPSHNs are developed for closure of Agnews DC and supported closure of Lanterman DC, Sonoma DC, Porterville DC (PDC) GTA and Fairview DC.

June 2012 – Fairview STAR opened for individuals court-ordered to DDS for up to 13 months of treatment and support.

May 2013 – DC Task Force convened to examine the future of the state’s developmental centers.

January 2014 – DC Task Force report established new models of care (State-Operated Acute Crisis services, EBSH and CCH).

July 2014 – DS Task Force convened to examine opportunities to strengthen the community-based services system.

April 2015 – Sonoma STAR opened.

May 2016 – DS Task Force Safety Net Workgroup met.

July 2016 – DS Task Force Safety Net Workgroup met.

September 2016 – DS Task Force Safety Net Workgroup met.

January/February 2017 – To inform the Safety Net Plan, DDS held three stakeholder workgroups (in Napa, Fresno and Costa Mesa) to discuss services for persons with significant behavioral and mental health needs, alternatives and transition options for persons with forensic needs, and safely transitioning individuals.

May 2017 – The Safety Net Plan for crisis and other safety net services was released to recommend services to support individuals with the most challenging service needs, using person-centered thinking and with a focus on cultural competence. The following services were developed:

- Additional STAR services (three homes in Northern California, two homes in Southern California)
- CAST services – state-operated mobile crisis services (North and South, began January 2018)
- Three vendor-operated PDC STP step-down homes to prepare individuals for the transition to their home community
- STP Intensive Wrap Around to support individuals during their transition into the community
- Four vendor-operated IMD step-down homes
- IMD Intensive Individualized Transition Services (ACRC and SGPRC contracts)

December 2017 – DDS staff begin scheduled on-going calls with RCs to plan services for individuals in IMDs and the DS Task Force Safety Net Workgroup met.

Chronology for Safety Net Support Services

April 19, 2021

February 2018 – DS Task Force Safety Net Workgroup met twice.

June 2018 – DS Task Force Safety Net Workgroup met.

September 2018 – SB 175 (Chapter 884, Statutes of 2018) designated up to 10 beds for Desert STAR services until June 2021.

Budget Act of 2019 – Authorized the following Safety Net Services:

- Central STAR serving adolescents (temporarily at PDC)
- Central CAST
- Two Central STAR homes in the community (permanent)
- CCH model expanded to children and adolescents - Four CCHs for children and adolescents will be developed through ACRC, RCEB, VMRC, and SDRC. The FY 2019-20 budget included funding for the development of three of these facilities; the fourth was funded through the FY 2019-20 CRDP.
- Two CCH homes and two EBSHs for children with multi-system involvement in RCEB and SDRC to support AB 2083 (Chapter 85, Statutes of 2018) efforts, funded with FY 2019-20 CPP funds
- Staffing for DDS and RCs to implement AB 2083
- 1:25 caseload ratio for consumers with complex needs
- Specialized home monitoring - RC staff monitor EBSHs, CCHs and ARFPHSNs on a monthly basis; DDS staff monitor every six months

February 2019 – DS Task Force Safety Net Workgroup met.

August 2019 – DS Task Force Safety Net Workgroup met.

November 2019 – To inform its updating of the Safety Net Plan, DDS held three stakeholder workgroups (in Napa, Fresno and Pomona).

December 2019 – DS Task Force Safety Net Workgroup met.

March 2020 – DDS released directives related to COVID-19 that:

- Required regional centers to request and receive approval from DDS prior to moving a person into a licensed residential setting to limit the exposure to COVID-19.
- Limited admissions and discharges to/from Porterville Developmental Center, Canyon Springs Community Facility, or a STAR Home until determined safe.
- Requires regional centers to report when an individual is tested for COVID-19, is hospitalized due to COVID, or passes away due to COVID through the special incident reporting system daily.

Chronology for Safety Net Support Services

April 19, 2021

April 2020 – DDS continued to release directives related to COVID-19, including:

- Waiving certification requirements for administrators, direct care lead staff or direct care staff in EBSH and CCHs to be certified as Registered Behavior Technicians.
- Amending reporting requirements for regional centers to report if an individual has tested positive or died as a result of COVID-19.

June 2020 – DDS continued to release directives related to COVID-19.

- Issuing a directive rescinding previous requirement that regional centers request DDS approval for placements into licensed residential settings, as regional centers are expected to continue to monitor safe movement.

Budget Act of 2020 – Authorized the following Safety Net Services, in addition to previously funded projects:

- The expansion of START services (with existing CPP funding) to the following regional centers: ACRC, RCEB, SCLARC, and WRC.
- Trailer bill language makes EBSHs permanent and revises cap for homes with delayed egress and secured perimeters.
- Temporary increase of the Porterville DC STP population limit. Establishes a diversion program for individuals with developmental disabilities.

July 2020 – DS Task Force Safety Net Workgroup met.

January 2021 – FY 2020/21 Governor's Budget included:

- Funding for foster youth returning from out-of-state to support their transition back to California.
- Specialized caseload ratios reflects an increase in the number of consumers with complex needs.
- Specialized home monitoring for additional EBSH and CCHs.
- Expand START to four more regional centers to support individuals in their current residential arrangement and prevent disruptions and admissions into more restrictive settings.
- 21 Regional Center Emergency Coordinators to coordinate emergency preparedness, response, and recovery activities for community consumers.
- Five regional center forensic specialist positions, three DDS staff positions, and funding for wrap-around services to individuals with IDD to support the expanded multifaceted forensic diversion program.

Children and Youth in the Child Welfare System: AB 2083 Implementation

BACKGROUND

Intent of AB 2083 is to develop a coordinated, timely, and trauma-informed system-of-care approach for foster children and youth who have experienced severe trauma.

- Approximately 5,700 minor court dependents are regional center consumers.
 - Each county to develop and implement a memorandum of understanding (MOU) with local system partners.
 - Establishment of a Joint Resolution Team.
 - Development of a technical assistance process for partner agencies.
 - Recommendations to address identified gaps in placement and service options.
 - Collaboration on a multi-year plan to increase systems capacity.

DDS

DDS has been implementing the requirements of AB 2083, via:

- Providing ongoing technical assistance and training to regional centers on MOU development and providing draft MOU feedback.
- Participation in local interagency child specific technical assistance calls in coordination with regional centers.
- Providing monthly statewide technical assistance webinars on the MOU provisions.
- Participating in the development of a universal data sharing agreement with AB 2083 State partners to integrate data and inform long-term capacity building for identified gaps in the continuum of care.
- Worked in collaboration with state and local partners to coordinate the transition of both regional center and potential regional center youth in returning to California from decertified out-of-state facilities.

REGIONAL CENTERS

- Developing and participating in local interagency leadership teams.
- Drafting MOUs with their local interagency leadership teams. To date the states MOU development progress includes: Complete 30%, In progress 67%, Not yet started 3%
- Participating and supporting coordination of services.
- Participating in local interagency child specific technical assistance calls.

COMMUNITY DEVELOPMENT FOR CHILDREN WHO ARE DUALY SERVED

RCEB and SDRC received approval and Community Resource Development Fund, to individually develop comprehensive residential services for children with complex needs and who have multi-agency involvement. Both RCs will develop one CCH and one EBSH for children who are dually served. A total of four homes will be developed, and will include:

- Comprehensive rate structures and enhanced case coordination
- Coordination to specialty mental health services and collaborating with nonpublic schools and local education agencies
- **UPDATE:** *Both RCEB and SDRC have awarded RFPs for the Housing Development Organization and service provider. The HDOs are in property search for the CCHs. Property is in escrow for the EBSH for RCEB and property has been secured for the SDRC EBSH.*
- *The homes have a projected service date of Fall/Winter 2021. DDS holds monthly calls with the RCs to track and monitor development and progress.*

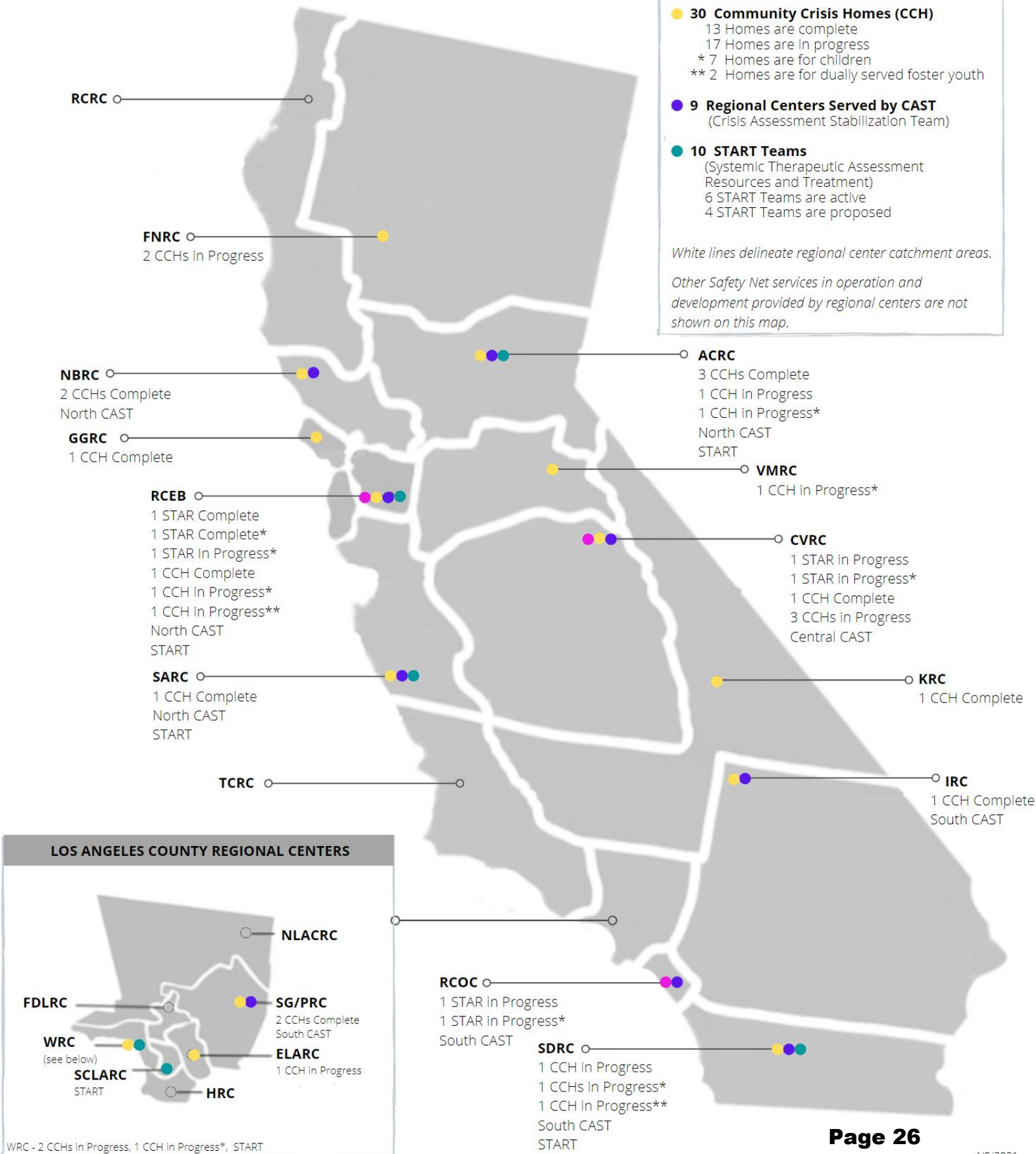

Community Supports & Safety Net Services
Workgroup Recommendations Summary
December 2019 and July 2020**

December 2019 Meeting Recommendations/Input on Priorities:

- Early identification and interventions are critical
 - Educate parents, pediatricians, first responders, DSP's early childhood educators on resources, how to access safety net services
- Increase the number of specialized providers:
 - BCBA's, speech therapists, LMFTs, psychiatrists, OT, PT, etc.
- Focus on prevention and de-escalation:
 - Enhanced behavioral day services
 - Discharge assessments
 - Transition to fully community-based day programming
 - Appropriate future person-centered planning
 - Mental health and medical assessment
- Increased employment opportunities/supports, coordination with DOR
- Knowledgeable, trained staff at necessary levels/ratios
 - Including available "substitute" staff
 - Provide adequate wages & identify ways to limit staff turnover
 - Build capacity of DSPs
 - Educate Service Coordinators on options
 - Explore a shareable menu of available crisis services, too much regional variability
- Continuity of care and collaboration, especially between settings/for transitions
- Identification/defining of crisis trends
 - How to develop services around different types of crisis or transitions
- Mobile crisis services need to be more accessible, more in-person vs. via phone, and provide training for staff, families, others involved
- Look for innovative ideas from similar fields:
 - Substance use disorder treatment, homelessness, mental health

July 2020 Meeting Recommendations/Input on Priorities:

- Solutions to challenges in providing crisis services remotely
 - Support if an individual or staff tests positive, utilizing the local public health department
 - Notify the regional center and DDS, share information to redirect crisis from the police
 - Outreach and education to families for Participant Directed Services
 - Systematically determine when to use virtual vs. direct contact service formats
 - Sharing of information and support for Assembly Bill 2054 to redirect crisis from the police department and providing racial equity training for residential staff
- Priorities to support CPP/CRDP funds for Safety Net Services
 - Service development, residential expansion, affordable housing, availability of local crisis services, expanding use of various service models (hybrids)
 - Increase connection with mental health for more efficiency
 - Use data to locate services, target need and identify models to provide coordinated services and development
 - Support for transitions from psychiatric facilities if not ready to return home
 - Expanding development of CCH and EBSH for depopulation of Porterville DC
 - Ensuring communities are safe with diversion for some felonies
 - Training for caregivers and staff in crisis prevention and be companions to the RBT
 - Staff development and retention, increase pay or opportunities for advancement for staff who work for licensing hours so that they stay once they obtain their license
 - Overall increase use of mental health and specialized professionals in the system to prevent crisis and increase retention, RBTs and LPTs to implement Behavior Specialist strategies to prevent crisis, develop medical consultants with experience service individuals with I/DD
 - Staff/individual matching may be an important part of preventing crises
