# Common Themes – DS Task Force & All Workgroups

From DS Task Force and Workgroup Discussions Through 2020:

- System funding, service consistency across regional centers, rural development
- Identify data gaps, develop qualitative and quantitative outcome measures, identify what is and isn't working for individuals and families
- Information sharing, training, skilled staff retention, provider knowledge of services, information of services that are accessible to individuals and families
- Expand crisis response to statewide disaster preparedness (earthquake, fires) to mobilize resources

## Safety Net Workgroup Recommendations – December 2019 & July 2020

- Early identification and interventions
- Identification/defining of crisis trends
- Focus on prevention and de-escalation
- Increase the number of specialized providers and knowledgeable, trained staff
- Service codes used to expand flexibility of services and use specialized providers
- Continuity of care and collaboration, especially between settings/for transitions
- Development of local crisis services and expanding various models
- Mobile crisis services need to be more accessible, more in-person vs. via phone, and provide training for staff, families, others involved
- Residential expansion, affordable housing, and transitional housing
- Increase employment opportunities/supports, coordination with DOR



- Support for children and adolescents
- Support for those transitioning from Porterville Secure Treatment Program
