PROJECT SUMMARY

Our Building a Culturally Appropriate Working Building in the Redwood Community project will create a pathway for all bi-lingual/bi-cultural youth to gain training and employment in their local communities, and to work with people of their own ethnicity and language. We will recruit participants from a Registered Behavioral Technician course, targeting Native American and Hispanic communities in our treatment area of Lake, Mendocino, Humboldt and Del Norte Counties. This course will be free for the participants and we will provide their materials and pay for an instructor. Community Colleges will provide a classroom and support in enrolling students. Students will receive support in taking the Competency Exam and applying for and taking the Certification Exam. Behavioral Agencies in our treatment area have hired people who have recently taken the RBT course. This project will fill a need in our most rural communities because local behavioral technicians and therapists are scarce. There are not enough bilingual bi-cultural people trained and employed to do this work. Creating a career ladder for people to serve our clients will remove a barrier that clients face, which is lack of services available to them in their own language/cultural framework. Through our partnerships with the local community colleges this course will grow into a sustainable ongoing training option. Our instructor will either be bilingual, bi-cultural we will hire a co-instructor whose ethnicity and/or language matches up with the students. We plan to recruit in all four counties and propose to conduct at least four 40-hour course sessions in various locations. We will work with local high schools, community colleges and community organizations to recruit students as well as advertise and promote the RBT classes at our events throughout the region. We propose to conduct our courses in all rural communities to increase the access to and quality of Redwood Coast Regional Center's underserved, geographically remote, American Indian Tribal community and Spanish-speaking population. We will continue to grow our relationships with our Native American and Hispanic communities by attending community events and presentations to high schools and community colleges.

Applicant Response Redwood Coast Regional Center serves four counties; Humboldt, Del Norte, Lake and Mendocino Counties. We have approximately 4,500 clients with developmental disabilities. We have received funding for projects through the DDS equity grants in 2016/2017, 2017/2018 and 2019/2020 and successfully carried out the projects, managing the grant funds and meeting objectives. Through focused outreach, we have been able to increase Purchase of Service for our Native American and Hispanic clients and decrease the number of clients with no PPS in those two ethnicities. We have met most of our 2019-2020 Grant objectives and expect to meet all of them by the end of December 2021. Through our 2019-2020 Equity Project funding we were able to upgrade our website www.redwoodcoastrc.org and begin a newsletter that goes out to our service providers, staff and clients. We completed all of our previous years' grants planned activities.

We will be finished with the project by December 31, 2021. We have met most of our measures and objectives so far. We were able to update our website and start a newsletter. We participated in many culturally identified events. Our 2019-2020 project is sustainable in that we will continue to do the outreach, newsletter and improve our website.</p>	1

Provide a summary of the differences and reasons why you are proposing the change.</p>	<p>Applicant Response</p> <p>The 2021-22 project includes outreach, training, family/caregiver support, and a primary goal of creating a career ladder for Latino and native workers within the developmental disabilities field. We will recruit and train participants for The Registered Behavior Technician (RBT) program. The RBT is an entry-level professional certification in the field of applied behavior analysis (ABA). ABA is the empirically validated best practice for individuals with autism. This project will increase capacity to services our clients and provide cultural and linguistically appropriate staff. All our current vendors are in need of bi-lingual/cultural staff. We will continue to advertise on the radio and attend culturally identified events. It is an important to build relationships with our diverse communities. Our geography is such that we must continue to contract with our Spanish Speaking Project Assistant in Mendocino and Lake Counties. Our target groups; Hispanic and Native Americans remain the same. We will continue to use PDS data to evaluate the impact of our activities. Our progress measures for Hispanic and Native American clients include increased Per Person expenditures and decrease number clients with no Purchase of Service. We expect that an RBT program aimed at training people situated in those communities will increase the number of clients in those communities and geographic areas who utilize behavior services. Added measures will be number of students enrolled in the RBT courses, number of agencies hiring newly trained RBTs, number of newly hired RBTs. We are proposing the change in measures and objectives, because an RBT program is a sustainable workforce capacity building project and we believe the new measures are appropriate to this new project.</p>

We will work with Agencies to encourage partnership with the community colleges to recruit employees from their student populations.</p> <p>The outcome of these activities will be to create a trained workforce to provide culturally responsive services for people needing behavioral therapy and to receive services from people located in their communities. Cultural responsiveness involves creating a workforce from within underserved communities.</p> <p>This project will serve as a potential model for replication in other underserved and remote communities.</p>

In your answer, include what experience your organization has working with the target population?</p>	<p>Our Buildin A Cultural Appropriate Workforce in the Redwood Community Project will create a pathway for local bi-lingual/ bi-cultural youth to gain training and employment in their local communities, and to work with people of their own ethnicity and language. We will recruit participants for a Registered Behavior Technician course, targeting Native American and Hispanic communities in our catchment area of Lake, Mendocino, Humboldt and Del Norte Counties.</p> <p>This course will be free for the participants and we will provide their materials and pay for an instructor. Community Colleges will provide a classroom for the class to be taught and support in reaching and enrolling students. We will pay for the exam, background check and application fee for the RBT Certificate.</p> <p>Registered Behavior Technicians assist people in learning to communicate using words, pictures or technology. They help teach and practice social skills that are important to making friends. Many of the skills they teach are cross-cultural, but the benefit of having an RBT who is part of the client's cultural includes more than just communication. Cultural responsiveness builds trust. Throughout our community meetings and data collection, many stakeholders have expressed a need for increased support in social skills.</p> <p>Several Behavioral Agencies in our catchment area have a need to hire people who have recently taken the RBT course. The requirements to take the certification exam are to have taken a 40-hour course, pass a competency assessment, be employed at a behavioral agency, pass the exam, apply for the certificate and submit a background check.</p> <p>This project will fill a need in our most rural communities because there are no local behavior technicians or therapists living in those areas. There are not enough bilingual or bi-cultural people trained or employed to do this work. One of the barriers our Hispanic and Native American clients face when receiving services is the lack of services available to them in their own language or cultural framework.</p> <p>Our instructor will either be bilingual, bi-cultural or we will hire a co-instructor whose ethnicity and/or language matches up with the students. We plan to recruit in all four counties and propose to conduct at least four 40-hour course sessions in various locations. We will work with local high schools, community colleges and community organizations to recruit students as well as advertise and promote the RBT classes at outreach events throughout our region.</p> <p>We believe that an RBT training program that would lead to employment for Hispanic and Native American youth in traditionally underserved communities will be well received and sustainable.</p> <p>We propose continued outreach in rural communities to increase the access to and quality of Redwood Coast Regional Center's underserved, geographically remote, American Indian Tribal community and Spanish-speaking population to grow our relationships in those communities.</p>

In your answer, include how your organization used input from the community and target population to design the project?</p>	<p>Applicant Response</p> <p>We have been speaking with community members when we do focused outreach with our Native American and Latinx communities about their needs. We have asked what the barriers are to receiving services and training. Two major barriers are geographic distance and lack of home-grown/cultural identified people working with them.</p> <p>These two ethnic populations are underserved because there are not many Native American and Hispanic people providing the services and our clients of those ethnicities are not receiving services in the amounts that our White clients receive. The Per Person expenditure data shows that on average White clients spend \$31,650 on services while Native American clients spend \$22,727 and Hispanic clients spend even less; \$14,050 and that includes PPS for translation services.</p>	3

If the project is similar to a uniquely funded grant listed on the Department's website, how is the proposed project different?</p>	<p>Applicant Response</p> <p>This project is unique because there are no other RBT programs in our area. There is a need in our catchment area to provide our clients with more behavioral services. It is difficult to find people already trained. This training will lead to employment with local behavioral agencies, who will sign off on the competency assessment. We will fund the cost of the RBT certification exam and travel associated with taking the exam on the nearest testing site which is 100 miles away. We will recruit participants who are ethnically diverse and who reside in our diverse rural communities. We will work with the College of the Redwoods to find instructors who are bilingual and/ or bi-cultural. Once students complete the 40-hour course, the background check, the competency assessment and pass the certification exam, they will be able to work for a living wage of at least \$18 per hour in our communities working with our clients.</p>	2

The first is that the lack of trained professionals in their immediate location and the other is the lack of access to training to culturally and linguistically diverse people.</p>

How will you collaborate with their organizations that serve individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families?</p>	<p>As a Regional Center that serves people in remote areas, we believe that this project will promote access and equity to essential services in those areas. Many of our linguistically and/or ethnically diverse clients and families live in remote areas of our counties where access to services is scarce. We believe that creating a training program that leads to employment with organizations that serve our clients will improve access to services. We expect that recruiting local people from within our culturally diverse communities, we will create a more culturally diverse and responsive workforce. Our clients and families are more likely to accept services from a person who shares their cultural identity. We will continue to conduct community outreach, as it has been key to our relationship building with diverse communities. We expect Purchase of Service to rise for both Hispanic and Native American clients.</p>

We will contract with Colle e of the Redwoods to provide the course through their community education program. We will either contract with a community college in Mendocino and Lake Co or run the class at our offices or another location.</p> <p>We will contract with a Spanish Speaking Project Assistant who will conduct outreach activities in Mendocino and Lake Counties with our Spanish speaking communities and with an outreach assistant who will specialize in travel to rural Native American communities to connect with families and network with service providers to build a sustainable rapport.</p> <p>Throughout the 2-year period, we will travel throughout our 4 counties to participate in job fairs, cultural identified events and presentations on school campuses in the effort to recruit students to take the RBT training. We will have ongoing radio ads and printed ads. We will continue working with and focus our outreach on Native American and Latinx communities and building our relationships with community partners in those communities.</p> <p>We will work with Colle e of the Redwoods to identify a start time for the course. We envision offering 4-5 courses beginning in April 2022. We will work with a campus/ campuses in Mendocino and/ Lake County to create a similar schedule of five courses.</p> <p>Each RBT course will consist of 40 hours of required training based on an established curriculum described in the RBT Handbook published by the Behavior Analyst Certification Board. The class will include an additional 10 hours for students to complete paperwork such as background check and certification application and prepare for the exam. There will be a class period for local behavior agencies to present themselves to the students and match up with students for supervision hours. The instructor will receive 30 hours of prep time for record keeping and documentation.</p> <p>After the 40 hours of required content the students will be placed with a behavior agency, where they will do supervised work with clients before a Competency Assessment, which is a checklist of 20 tasks administered by a qualified individual. Then the student submits a Certification Application and uploads their Competency Assessment, Certificate of 40 hour training and high school diploma or equivalent. The agency will also identify an RBT Supervisor at the agency that is willing to hire them. It takes two weeks to process the Certification Application. After that, the student can register for the RBT exam.</p> <p>Students will travel to the nearest Pearson VUE exam site or take the exam online. It is unclear whether all students from our region will be able to take the exam online. We budgeted to pay for their travel to the exam site or purchase internet boosters or other equipment needed to meet system requirements.</p> <p>The goal is that participating agencies hire 75 newly trained RBTs by January 2024.</p>

There are also measures that track the RBT program such as number of courses, number of students taking the class, number passing the competency assessment and the number of newly trained RBTs hired by agencies. We included measures that track the Purchase of Service and Per Person expenditures of RCRC clients to demonstrate the impact that the project has on our clients' access to services. Our budget includes a contract with College of the Redwoods, and materials, instruction, background checks for Mendocino Counties and exam fees and certification applications for students in all four counties.</p> <p>We believe that the budget is consistent with the grant activities and measures.</p>	4

Costs funded by other sources.</p>	<p>Applicant Response</p> <p>This project will include recruitment of participants for an RBT certification program. Our budget reflects the cost of outreach and recruitment efforts, including a project assistant who will cover our southern two counties. We believe that given the size of our catchment area this additional team member, as well as travel through our region is essential in reaching all areas of our geographically diverse region.</p> <p>The budget for the RBT course including the instructor and bilingual assistant, and materials is appropriate given that we intend to reach diverse participants who may not use English as a first language. We are hoping to run 10 courses, 5 in the north and 5 in the south of our region.</p> <p>We budget for every expense a participant would come up against; travel to the exam, background check fee, certification application, exam cost, books and study materials. We want to make this program accessible to diverse participants.</p> <p>We are not including any items in our budget that is not permitted. We are not including out of state travel to a testing center even though it may be the closest testing center for some participants.</p>
