SUBJECT: RATE STUDY IMPLEMENTATION – RATES FOR PROVIDERS WHO SERVE CONSUMERS FROM MULTIPLE REGIONAL CENTERS

In March 2019, the Department of Developmental Services (DDS) published a rate study addressing the sustainability, quality, and transparency of community-based services for individuals with developmental disabilities. The Budget Act of 2021 specifies a timeline for implementation of the rate models proposed in the rate study. For providers who serve consumers from multiple regional centers under a single vendorization, the Department used the list below to determine the applicable rate for rate adjustments effective April 1, 2022.

Rate models take into consideration costs providers incur to deliver a particular service consistent with the state's requirements, including where the service is delivered. The general principle reflected in the lists below is that rates are determined based on where the service is delivered. For example, if the service is usually a site/facility-based or entirely provided in the vendoring regional center's catchment area, the April 1, 2022 rate will be determined based on the vendoring regional center's rate model. However, for services that are not site/facility-based or entirely provided in the purchasing regional center's catchment area, the April 1, 2022 rate will be determined based on the purchasing regional center's rate model. Providers may have multiple rates for the same service when services are provided in multiple regional center catchment areas.
