





# COMMON SAFETY NET ACRONYMS

CAST	<ul> <li>Crisis Assessment Stabilization Teams (CAST)</li> <li>State-operated mobile crisis services</li> </ul>
ССН	<ul> <li>Community Crisis Homes (CCH)</li> <li>Residential facilities that provide 24-hour non-medical care to adults &amp; children w/ developmental disabilities (DD) in need of crisis intervention services</li> </ul>
HDO	<ul> <li>Housing Developer Organization (HDO)</li> <li>"Buy It Once" model where the HDO owns the property for the restricted use by regional center consumers.</li> </ul>
IMD	<ul> <li>Institutions for Mental Disease (IMD)</li> <li>Residential facilities with 16 or more beds used to treat mental illness &amp; receive medical/ nursing care; considered a highly restrictive setting</li> </ul>
PDC-STP	<ul> <li>Porterville Developmental Center (PDC) Secure Treatment Program (STP)</li> <li>The STP serves individuals who are committed for placement through the criminal justice system.</li> </ul>
STAR Homes	<ul> <li>Stabilization Training Assistance Reintegration (STAR)</li> <li>Serves children/adolescents (7-17 yrs old) &amp; adults (18+ yrs old) receiving regional center services in need of time-limited crisis stabilization services for up to 13 months</li> </ul>
START Program	<ul> <li>Systemic, Therapeutic, Assessment, Resources and Treatment (START)</li> <li>Serves individuals aged 6+ residing in-home &amp; out-of-home w/person-centered, trauma-informed, evidence-based, positive supports</li> </ul>
DE/SP Homes	<ul> <li>Delayed Egress Secured Perimeter (DE/SP)</li> <li>For consumers determined to require enhancement to staff supervision with delayed egress devices &amp; secured perimeters (locked fence/gate around the home)</li> </ul>


# Reasons for referral for children (ages 6-17) and adults (ages 18+) enrolled in START services statewide in October 2022

Aggression (physical, verbal, property destruction, threats)	81%	70%
At risk of losing placement	23%	38%
Decrease in ability to participate in daily functions	24%	27%
Diagnosis and treatment plan assistance	24%	36%
Family needs assistance	71%	42%
Leaving unexpectedly	40%	24%
Mental health symptoms	52%	67%
Self-injurious	39%	29%
Sexualized behavior	12%	13%
Suicidality concerns	31%	23%
Transition from hospital or facility-based placement setting	*%	*%



# DATA OVERVIEW – STAR HOMES

#### Post-STAR Transitions Since 2019


- STAR has transitioned 67 individuals to community homes
- Among those who transitioned, 88% of individuals remained in the homes they transitioned to
  - 12% experienced a crisis after moving & had to move to a higher level of care
- Among those who went into crisis and moved to a higher level of care
  - 88% experienced those crises within the first 3 months post-STAR
  - 12% within the 4th-6th month post-STAR
