Family Support Network is a community based, non-profit organization located in Orange, CA. We have been serving Orange County for 37 years. Our mission is to "provide services offering resources and advocacy for families with children with social, emotional, intellectual, and physical needs so they may reach their full potential." FSN began as an organization serving families with children with special needs and has expanded to serve families at risk. We have been providing free, comprehensive, Developmental Screenings in the county for over 25 years. These screenings are provided for children aged 0-5 who would benefit from early intervention services. FSN provides connection, resources and follow-up to assure that families are receiving appropriate services. We are also vendors of the Regional Center of Orange County for Parent Education and with the Department of Rehabilitation to provide language assistance devices to those with significant language disabilities.

In support of DDS's promotion of Early Start Services to diverse communities, FSN will mitigate barriers to accessing those early interventions by providing comprehensive, developmental milestone screening and then providing referrals and direct linkage services for parent education for behavioral coaching, community outreach services, primary care physicians, school district services and other needed resources (including lifeline resources). We have programs within FSN that will support this community in a "whole-child" approach, including our behavior coaching program, Bloom, and our systems navigation mentors who support the families and clients of the Regional Center. The screening program has been in existence for over 25 years and the sustainability of it has been a direct result of the continuity of the service, the support of community partners and grant funders, and the continued support and assistance of the Regional Center of Orange County.

Because of the program format and the community-based outreach, all children, regardless of ethnicity or economic status are eligible for our Developmental Screening Program. Historically, however, we anticipate a high engagement rate with those of Hispanic heritage. We do, however, serve all communities within our county and provide the necessary information for them to access early intervention services. The selection of host sites depends on the demographic of the community and the targeted population.

Applicant Response:

Family Support Network (FSN) has been providing Developmental Screenings to Orange County families for more than 25 years and providing resources and community connections to families at risk for the last 37. We have worked with the Regional Center of Orange County to provide system navigation and parent education for their persons served through our mentoring programs. Our commitment to serve our community begins with early intervention. We know that reaching these families and children early will provide better long-term educational, social and emotional outcomes for the child and the family. That is at the heart of why we began the Developmental Screening program. During this grant period, FSN will offer 14 screenings. These screenings are held throughout Orange County at places like Family Resource Centers, Boat People SOS, Boys & Girls Clubs, community centers, and pre-schools. Regional Center of Orange County works closely with FSN to provide on-site support for immediate referral for Early Start services, Provisional Lanterman and Lanterman services. The Developmental Screenings are held in neighborhoods where there are diverse and underserved populations in Orange County. This project gives families with children age birth-five years an opportunity to check on their child's physical, cognitive, and emotional development to make sure they are developing on track. The screenings offer hands-on assessments that are conducted by licensed therapists and specialists covering the following areas of development: vision, fine and gross motor skills, speech and language, emotional/behavioral health, general overall health, and dental wellness. Each focus area has its own station where the parent/caregiver can meet with the therapist or specialist individually to discuss any concerns they might have about their child. Translators and bilingual specialists are available to assist non-English speaking families. Every family is given a copy of their child's Developmental Screening results as well as any recommended referrals including the Regional Center, LEAs, Optometrists, Dentists, Mental Health, Primary Care Physician and FSN Behavior Intervention and Coacahing (Bloom) program. Every family receives follow up calls to assure that they were able to access the recommended services and to assist them if there was a barrier of any kind. FSN checks with the families to assess their need for lifeline resources such as food and housing. If they family needs assistance accessing those services, FSN directs them to those resources. The developmental screenings increase access to early intervention and offer families the opportunity to connect to other necessary resources within our community such as MediCal and CalFresh services.

Applicant Response:

We align the ethnic communities we serve with overall county population percentages. According to Regional Center data and the utilization of census data reflecting the population ethnicity demographic for Orange County, we have focused our planning and outreach to address the Hispanic, Asian, and African American communities as our target populations. According to Kidsdata.org, the census data (2020) for Orange County children aged 0-17 reflect the following: African American 1.6%; Asian 17%; Hispanic/Latino 46.7%; Non-Hispanic/White 29.2% and those who identify as multiracial represent 8.2%. All other groups represent less than 1% of the population. As of October 2021, RCOC served 4277 Asian individuals in both Early Start and Lanterman programs (18.5% of total persons served). Comparing the current data with data from past years, RCOC had only served about 13% Asian population in 2017, and 17.3% Asian population in 2019. The Vietnamese segment is the third largest in Orange County, so we will be committing our outreach efforts to focus on that community. For the Hispanic and African American communities, we will continue to outreach and to provide screening locations in those neighborhoods. In the past year we have screened 359 children with 287 referrals for follow up services. The ethnicities of those screened align accurately with our county population and ethnicity data.

Applicant Response:

There are no other currently funded programs supporting in-person developmental screenings on this broad scale. We have received grant funding in a variety of ways to keep us going through the years. Most recently, last year, RCOC received this grant to assist us in maintaining this unique and necessary program. The community has been incredibly supportive over the years, and we continue to outreach and fill in "gaps" in the community. Because of our longevity in this space, and our reliability, we have been tapped by a wide swath of organizations and agencies who need a comprehensive screening and want to offer it to their clientele. We work closely with Family Resource Centers, BPSOS, Boys and Girls Clubs, school districts, and other site hosts. Primary care pediatricians and school districts have come to acknowledge our referrals as reliable, and they act accordingly. Our community partners have grown to include the Social Services Administration who sometimes recommend their foster/resource parents to our screenings. Regional Center is on site with us at all of our screenings and so referrals are immediate. This program is unique to Family Support Network.

How will your project measurably improve equity, access, and reduce barriers to services for individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families?

Applicant Response:

Family Support Network has 37 years of experience serving families who are non-English speaking. We know that often, they aren't comfortable traveling outside of their neighborhoods or communities. The stigma on disabilities and cultural differences creates barriers to accessing needed services. Developmental Screenings in local neighborhoods with bilingual staff and/or interpreters on-site will increase the opportunity for families to bring their child to a Developmental Screening and obtain needed services. Staff from RCOC are always present at the screening site to assist families with the intake process for Early Start and Provisional Lanterman Programs. We provide behavior coaching for families whose children are identified through the ASQse2 and through interview. We provide referrals to school districts and primary care physicians for further follow-up. After the screenings, our staff reach out to complete the circle of care for families by offering warm linkages. FSN has been an integral partner in many of the county resource platforms like OC Navigator and Unite Us. Through these connections and continued collaborations with community partners, we can provide resources that align with the needs of the children and families. This one-on-one attention increases trust and improves equitable access to the services children need to live up to their full potential.

Applicant Response:

Under-served families are less likely to access Developmental Screenings due to lack of transportation, fear of going to unfamiliar places, as well as lack of knowledge of the importance of early intervention. By providing Developmental Screenings in the neighborhoods of non-English speaking families (i.e., at local family resource centers, community clinics, pre-schools, etc.) with bilingual staff and/or interpreters available on-site, more under-served families will be able to access RCOC services, helping to diminish the current disparity. Family Support Network will collaborate with the Regional Center of Orange County and other community-based organizations that serve individuals with intellectual and developmental disabilities and their families to share in the outreach efforts to promote the screenings and to secure locations in communities that represent gathering spaces for the target populations. Follow up phone calls with participants will allow FSN to offer resources and supports that the families will be able to access in order to minimize feelings of isolation while building confidence in accessing equitable early intervention services for their child, giving a sense of an improved long-term outcome.

Family Support Network will collaborate with Regional Center and the other community-based organizations that provide the screening services. We will schedule fourteen Developmental Screenings in diverse and under-served areas of Orange County. Family Support Network will work to secure venues and coordinate the schedule for the screenings; conduct community outreach; conduct the screenings; complete follow-up with families post-screening; and collect data. Data will reflect: the total number of children served; the number of children within the target populations; the number of referrals made to Regional Center; the number of community referrals given; the number of emergency needs resources provided; and the number of outreach efforts made in each target community. FSN will conduct at least one follow up phone call for each screening participant and will assist families in accessing services.

Applicant Response:

The Developmental Screening Program has the objective of increasing accessibility to early intervention services for some of the most underserved children in our community. Family Support Network will provide 14 comprehensive Developmental Screenings over the course of a 12-month period. It is estimated that at a minimum, 280 children will be screened, and referrals will be made for services including Early Start services through the Regional Center of Orange County. The grant request amount of \$150,000 will fund these screenings which will cover the costs of FSN personnel who will oversee the program, the subcontractors who will provide the licensed professionals who will complete the screenings, the outreach marketing materials to promote the event, and other necessary operational costs.

The breakdown of expenses is detailed in the budget report: Personnel expenses: \$94,783 for 1.5 FTE employees and 13% of the Executive Director' FTE. Translators are hired per diem.

Operating Expenses include subcontractor costs, copy cost for intake/referral paperwork; mileage; marketing materials, etc. That amount comes to \$47.150.

Administrative and Indirect Costs at \$8,067 to maintain the IT/Website; financial audits, and costs associated with accounting services.

It is important to mention that this screening program has been in existence for 25 years. FSN already have staff in place who have the Developmental Screening as their job responsibility. Our subcontractors have worked with us for many years, and we are experienced in knowing approximately how many staff from each specialty area will be needed for each host location. The subcontractors submit invoices to FSN for the number of staff attending the screening at a set rate (\$300 per therapist/specialist, per screening event. The number of screeners varies based on host site and outreach efforts.). Paperwork needed for the screening has already been translated and it is necessary only to reorder when needed. Family Support Network utilize volunteers whenever possibly to help defray staffing costs.
