Section 54001 - Substantial Handicap Disability

- (a) "Substantial handicap disability" means:
 - (1) a A condition which results in major impairment of cognitive and/or social functioning. Moreover, a substantial handicap represents—a condition of representing sufficient impairment to require interdisciplinary planning and coordination of special or generic services to assist the individual in achieving maximum potential; and
 - (2) The existence of significant functional limitations, as determined by the regional center, in three or more of the following areas of major life activity, as appropriate to the person's age:
 - (A) Communication skills Receptive and expressive language;
 - (B) Learning;
 - (C) Self-care;
 - (D) Mobility;
 - (E) Self-direction;
 - (F) Capacity for independent living;
 - (G) Economic self-sufficiency.
