What is the ICC?

The ICC is a diverse group of stakeholders who provide advice and assistance to the Department of Developmental Services regarding the early intervention system for children, ages birth to three years, known as "Early Start" in California. The mission of the ICC is to promote and enhance a coordinated family service system for infants and toddlers who have, or are at risk of having, a developmental delay or disability. The quarterly ICC meetings are open to the public and provide a forum for community members to offer information and input on issues relating to early intervention and early childhood learning.
