





# Paid Internship Program and Competitive Integrated Employment FY 2022-2023 Report (Through June 2023)

#### Paid Internship Program (PIP)

- 2,573 individuals participating in PIP
- 5,641 unique individuals participating in PIPs since implementation in 2016

#### Paid Internship Program-Incentive Payments (PIP-IP)

978 individuals served by 151 providers

#### Competitive Integrated Employment-Incentive Payments (CIE-IP)

- 1,831 individuals achieved a CIE milestone
- 6,134 unique individuals achieving CIE milestones since CIE-IP implementation in 2016



## California Opportunity Youth Apprenticeship Grant

\$25 Million grant through Department of Industrial Relations

- Funding for existing and new programs
- Geared towards youth ages 16-24
- Non-profits, community-based organizations, workforce partners, labor unions and educational institutions
