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## Adaptive Skills Training and Behavioral Services FAQs

**Adaptive Skills Training and Behavioral Services Directive** 

#### Q1. I am an adaptive skills trainer, but do not have a degree. Am I still able to provide this service?

A1. Rates were established for those with applicable master's or bachelor's degrees. Services provided by non-degreed staff will be transitioned to other service areas that align with services being provided, such as Independent Living.

#### Q2. I am an adaptive skills trainer, with a bachelor's degree. Am I able to work on my own?

A2. Prior to rate reform, regulations limited staff to those with a master's degree. The Department has now approved both masters and bachelor's level staff to provide the service. However, bachelor's level staff must work under the supervision of a master's level staff.

### Q3. I am a behavioral service provider. I currently meet the requirements for my service code, but I have staff who do not. Are they able to bill the same as me since I meet the requirements?

A3. As defined by California Code of Regulations, Title 17, section 54319, service providers must provide services and bill based on the credential level of the staff providing the direct service. Regional centers will need to verify that providers meet the requirements of the vendored service code.



Q4. I operate a group practice and utilize behavioral paraprofessionals. What
is the appropriate billing code for these staff?  A4. Behavioral paraprofessionals will bill under code 616.
