ENHANCED SERVICE COORDINATION

FACTSHEET

What to Know

Enhanced Service Coordination (ESC) is a person-centered service. Established for individuals from underserved communities who have utilized low to no (\$0-\$1,999) Purchase of Service (POS) through the regional center. Each regional center was provided funding to establish a set amount of ESC caseloads within their regional center.

Highlights

- Specially trained service coordinators (SCs) have a reduced ESC caseload of 1:40.
- Reduced caseloads will allow SCs to increase their contact with individuals/families in ESC.
- ESC provides increased coordination and focuses to improve access to regional center services. This could include services like in-home/out of home respite and adult day programs.
- SCs provide guidance to help individuals/families navigate California's developmental disabilities services system, including generic services and supports through public agencies and organizations. This could include services like CalFresh, a child's Individualized Education Plans (IEP), Medi-Cal and Medicare.
- The Department of Developmental Services will send questionnaires to gather feedback from individuals/families in ESC.
- ESC is optional. Individuals/families can choose to exit ESC at any time.
