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# **Opening**

Doug Erber, ICC co-chair, called the meeting to order at 9:02 a.m.

# Housekeeping Items

Zoom instructions, ASL/Spanish interpreter instructions, and meeting etiquette were reviewed by Jasmine Suo.

### Roll Call

Roll call was conducted by DJ Tomko.

# Review of Previous Day's Agenda

Mr. Erber reviewed yesterday's agenda and announced that all presentation materials will be posted on the DDS ICC website.

# Review of ICC Mission, Purpose, and Theme

Mr. Erber reviewed the ICC mission and purpose. This guarter's theme is Moving Forward.

Presentation: Medi-Cal to Early Start Warm Handoffs – Mike Odeh (Children Now), Alexandra Parma (First 5 Center for Children's Policy), and Colleen Corrigan (Children Now)

Children Now is a statewide policy and research advocacy organization. Presenters introduced the Warm Handoffs Project, a collaborative project between state agencies, advocates, and managed care plans to develop a policy for a Warm Handoff procedure between Medi-Cal providers and Early Start.

The presenters provided background on Medi-Cal and Early Start. They identified various problems with Medi-Cal and Early Start that serve as barriers to efficient referrals, particularly for low-income children of color.

The presenters defined "Warm Handoffs" as a family-centered approach and provided examples of what a warm handoff looks like in practice. They identified potential challenges of Warm Handoffs.

Mr. Odeh introduced a breakout room discussion activity for ICC participants. Breakout rooms began at 9:26 a.m.

Breakout rooms ended at 10:26 a.m. and Mr. Odeh provided next steps for the Warm Handoffs planning group: stakeholder input will continue through the summer, and the planning group will develop recommendations for the Department of Health Care Services.

# **Committee Reports and Approval for Projects**

# Improving State Systems Committee - Fran Chasen

Yesterday's conversation focused on Early Start concerns in the community, primarily around status of federal funding and its impact on Early Start. The Committee reviewed the purpose and process from the Voices from the Field survey, which is now in the stage of composing letters that will be sent out within two weeks, via ICC partner agencies, to parents and providers.

Additionally, the Committee is identifying priorities for discussion, committee action, and possible recommendations for the coming year. The Committee will be conducting outreach efforts to improve membership and meet required quorums.

# Communications and Outreach Committee - Robert Rochin

The Committee developed five recommendations to support engagement and ICC representation:

- 1. Clearly define and actively promote the purpose of the ICC
- 2. Re-evaluate ICC outreach materials for efficacy and inclusivity
- 3. Empower current members as champions of the ICC, especially in populations identified as underrepresented
- 4. Establishment of a mentorship program to strengthen onboarding for new members
- 5. Continue to guide recruitment through a diversity lens by reviewing membership demographics annually

The Committee will work on activities to support each of these recommendations.

# **Public Input**

DJ Tomko reviewed public input guidelines.

Doug Erber shared a <u>national call to action</u> taking place at 1 p.m. today on proposed budget cuts to Head Start programs.

 Jane Lee of DDS shared a <u>document with all links</u> shared during yesterday's public comment period which included additional calls to action.

Yvette Baptiste, Executive Director of FRCNA, recognized an increase in partner participation in this quarter's meeting and shared appreciation for FRC and RC engagement.

Michelle Oliver, a community member, requested continued advocacy for connecting NICU families to Early Start before the infant returns home as the best way to support those overwhelmed families.

- DJ Tomko reminded attendees of a NICU project that was presented during <u>October's ICC meeting</u>. Those materials are available on the <u>DDS ICC website</u>.
- Apple Sepulveda, Community Representative, echoed Ms. Oliver's call for advocacy, as parents of children in NICUs have significant psychosocial needs – particularly maternal depression – and require ongoing support.

Suzanne Sherinian, Department of Managed Health Care, stated that if anyone is having trouble accessing covered health care services through health plan coverage or knows someone that is, please contact DMHC or Ms. Sherinian directly.

# **Recap and Closing Remarks**

Doug Erber thanked participants and presenters on the productive discussions and information presented. Mr. Erber encouraged all participants to engage with their representatives to advocate for Early Start and developmental services funding. Mr. Erber thanked DDS and WestEd for supporting the meetings.

The next ICC meetings for 2025 are July 17-18, 2025, and October 16-17, 2025.
