Important notice from the Department of Developmental Services about:

G-2025-Case Management-002 Environmental Accessibility Service Code 104

What to Know

If someone needs to make changes to their home to be more independent or safe, regional centers can help. The companies are called service providers or vendors. These companies help people with developmental disabilities stay safe and move around their homes more easily. This letter explains how regional centers should use this service. This service is called Environmental Accessibility. Vendors can charge the regional center using service code 104.

This service can help with things like:

- Adding ramps
- Installing grab bars
- Widening doorways
- Changing bathrooms to make them easier to use
- Setting up special electric or plumbing for medical equipment

The code does not include general things that are not related to a person's disability:

- Adding new carpet
- Fixing the roof
- Air conditioning
- Making the house bigger

Any changes to homes must follow local and state building laws. The vendors must have the right licenses, certifications, and business permits to do the job.
